

CAMP GUIDELINES

What to bring and what NOT to bring with you.

You should bring:

- · Bible, pen or pencil
- · Pillow w/ pillow case
- · Thin blanket
- · Plenty of clothing including shorts, T-shirts, long pants, sweatshirts, pajamas, socks, rain coat and underwear enough for 3 day stay at camp. Shirts should cover the shoulders. Clothing for church service (girls skirts, boys pants)
- · Extra clothes for VERY messy/wet/muddy activities
- · Plastic bag for wet clothes
- · Goggles
- · 1-2 towel
- · Hat
- · Sneakers and/or walking shoes
- · Insect repellant and sun screen
- · Flip flops for shower use
- Bathing suits (Ladies: one-piece bathing suits or dark shirts over 2-piece suits)
- · Toiletries: Toothbrush and toothpaste, deodorant, hairbrush, shampoo and conditioner, soap, sanitary items
- · PERSONAL WATER BOTTLE
- · Prescription medication if needed
- · Flashlight and batteries (optional)

You should NOT bring:

- · ANY electronic devices (including headphones) The staff will not take responsibility for broken or lost devices. The staff has the right to confiscate any electronic device and return it at the end of the camp.
- · Weapons or knives of any kind
- · Alcohol or drugs of any kind
- · Fireworks
- · Make-up
- · Gum
- · Valuables
- · Inappropriate clothing (that includes but is not limited to tank tops, leggings or other tight pants/ skirts and short pants and skits)

Behavior Management Policy

The camp is designed to be a safe, caring and uplifting place where all campers feel welcome and can experience God's love. When campers choose not to follow directions, obey safety procedures or bully others, they put their own safety and the safety of other campers at risk. Camp staff will provide clear instruction about rules and expectations at the start of camp and throughout activities.

If a child is involved in a serious incident, the parent/ guardian will be informed. If the camper is willing to work through the issue and resolve conflicts, they will be allowed to return to their cabin/activity. If a camper's behavior is severe or ongoing, parents will be required to remove their child from camp at their own expense with no refund.
